

MAYS Updates:

- No Heading in U10 and U12→ Indirect free kick to opposing team
- Suspected head injury? – player comes out until ok'd by medical professional.
- Prior to game day reach out to opposing coach and confirm place, time jersey colors etc...
- Home coach is always responsible for jersey color issues-→ keep pinnies in your kit.
- Home coach is responsible for field being set up and inspected.- weights on goals, flags in place, lines clear to see.
- Bring 2 copies of roster, with “approved” watermark. Signed. For each game
- All coached to have CORI card and coaches card to be on sidelines. (No exceptions)
- MAX 3 coaches on the sideline during a game
- Coaches cannot cancel games. Coaches cannot reschedule games via a phone call. Follow Sportsmanager process-→ game cancellation request and then game rescheduling request.
- Keep emails up to date in Sportmanager
- Sportsmanship-→ 8 goal rule
- Uniforms→ D1 and D2 stress that uniforms must match.. (even socks)
- Passcards U12 and U14 D1 and D2- hand them out to players before game ref checks them in.
- Get them back from the ref and hold on to them

- Tobacco use, smoking of any kind, electronic cigarettes, alcohol, and artificial noisemakers are prohibited at any MAYS game
- For any team that does not play one or both of their last two games at the Gaffney Fun Day of Soccer (U12 and U14 Division 3), their town/club will be fined \$100 per game.
- There are no recording devices that can be used on the team side of the field for any reason except for calling 911 or time keeping. This includes videotaping for your own record keeping.
- zero tolerance -> both coaches and parents

- **No one is to address the referee during the Match!**
- Exceptions for persons responsible for a team (Coaches and Managers)
- **During the game:**
- 1. Responding to a referee initiating communication.
- 2. Making Substitutions
- 3. Pointing out emergencies or safety issues

- **At half-time or at the end of a match:**
- 1. A coach/manager can ask a referee to explain a rule(s) in a polite and constructive manner.
- 2. Polite and friendly feedback can be given to a referee.
- 3. Absolutely NO sarcasm, harassment or intimidation.
