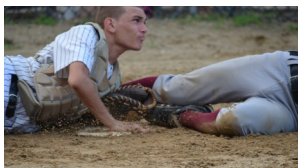

We had a record number of games played at DG's home field; Harvey Park. The purchase of the new tractor last year has proven to be a wise investment. With over 100 children, 4-5 year olds playing T-Ball, our new T-Ball field at Harvey Park has been a big hit with all young T-Ballers and parents. Overall, 346 kids registered for this past spring baseball season and it is expected to grow even more by next spring. We had 10 T-Ball teams, 6 Mini Mite teams, 5 Mite teams, 4 Minor teams, 3 Major teams 2 Pony teams, and 1 Senior team. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Coaches Anthony Marotta, Mike Zampino and the DG 9-10 year old team, sponsored by Axon Electric for going undefeated and winning the Northeast Alliance Minor Division Championship. A job well done!

We have just ended our busiest basketball season at DG with the wrap up of our Spring League on June 25th. We had 200 players in the Spring Season, which included our new 9th Grade League. Our program continues to be very healthy. DG Basketball's overall enrollment was up by 15% this year. We had over 500 boys in the Winter and over 200 players in the Spring League.

This year we continued to make many improvements to the program.

- We had new lights fixtures installed at the building. They are energy efficient and really brighten the gym.
- Two new digital scoreboards were installed.
- Eight foot rims were installed to allow proper shooting fundamentals to be taught to our younger players
- We rented PS 79 to handle the overflow of games and offer additional practice time
- Mike Panella, Assistant Coach at Manhattanville College and Director of Higher Ground Basketball, ran individual and group clinics for players wanting to take their game to the next level.
- Many of our former players are giving back. They are now coaches in our league.

We strive to have a well-rounded program at DG. While we offer a place to play for the recreational player ages 4-18, I was happy to see so many former DG players now playing at the High School level. Next year we will have another DG player playing college basketball as well!

Our program would not be as successful without the help of so many parents and friends. I would like thank them for their support through the year. 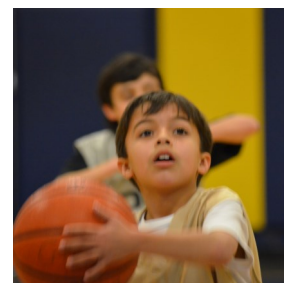
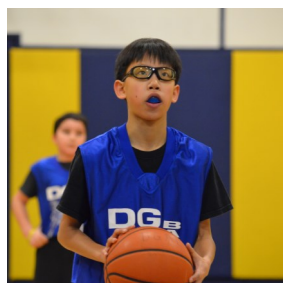
