Rules of the Game

A player is in an offside position if he/she is ahead of the ball, unless:

- The player is in his/her own half of the field of play, or
- He/she is not nearer to the opponents' goal line than the second-to-last defender

A player shall not be declared offside and penalized:

- Merely for being in an offside position or
- If he/she receives the ball directly from a goal kick, corner kick, throw in or dropped by the referee.

A player shall only be declared offside and penalized for being in an offside position if, at the moment the ball is played by one of his/her team, he/she in the opinion of the referee is:

- Interfering with play or with an opponent, or
- Gaining an advantage by being in that position,

If a player is declared offside, the referee shall award an indirect free kick, which shall be taken by any player of the opposing team from the approximate place where the offside player was standing.

Turf Policy

NO - glass containers of any kind, metal cleats, food or drink (water allowed), sports drinks, smoking, scooters, bicycles, gum or seeds

NO - Chairs or tents on the synthetic surface. Must be place on pavement

The [Massachusetts State Referee Committee \(MSRC\)](#) is the state association for the United States Soccer Federation (USSF). The MSRC is mandated to provide referee training, certification, assessment, and education for soccer officials engaged in youth, adult amateur and professional USSF affiliated matches in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

As the sport of soccer has grown, so has the committee. Today there are over 4,000 certified USSF referees in Massachusetts, officiating more than 350,000 competitions annually.

Coach Aaron's Soccer Tip ...

10 Sportsmanship lessons every young soccer player should learn:

1. **Respect the rules of the game:** There's a reason why there are rules. It's to make sure the game is fair and fun, and to help keep the players safe.
2. **Treat others the way you want to be treated:** Saying mean things about and to your opponents is disrespectful to them, the game you all love and even your own teammates. Skip the trash talk no body is impressed.
3. **Respect not only your teammates but also the opponents:** There is no 'I' in team. It's also important to not put the other team down whether better or worse.
4. **Respect your coaches and the match officials:** The coach and officials are there to provide direction. Whether you're a parent or a player, if you disagree with the coach, discuss it respectfully in private.
5. **Always Play fair:** A win earned by cheating doesn't feel nearly as good as an honest victory.
6. **Accept the judgment calls of the coaches and officials:** Arguing with an official over a judgment call wastes energy and time. Errors may be made, but a Player and Parent should also know that a game is made up of all the plays and calls from the beginning to end. Not just the one in dispute.
7. **Forgive yourself:** when you make a mistake and get right back into the game. Part of the human condition is making mistakes it's how we learn. Accept it and focus back on the competition and on doing the best you can.
8. **Say "Thank you":** Tell your coaches, the officials, volunteers and parents you appreciate all the time and effort they put into your sport.
9. **Win without gloating:** If you out perform an opponent, enjoy the victory but do not gloat, belittle or minimize the opponent's effort in anyway. We have all lost at one point.
10. **Lose with grace:** Take responsibility for your losses, placing blame on the other team, your teammates, the weather or the officials will not make the next game easier. Learn from the L's.
